This day is an amalgamation of two related sessions. Morning: Map-Making and World-Building as a Creative and Cross-Curricular Expression From Middle Earth to the Hundred Acre Wood, world-building is integral in storytelling, and map-making is one facet of this creativity that incorporates aspects of science, math, and social studies. This map-making activity bridges creativity, imagination, and topographical awareness as we also address famous literary maps and the role they play in the compositions themselves. Participants will follow steps to create their own maps in a session adapted (with permission) from one presented at this year's SWATCA. Artistic ability is not required, but willingness (and pre-registration!) is. Afternoon: Dungeons and Dragons as Social-Emotional Learning/ Storytelling/ and Math Okay, you have your worlds built and your maps made. Now what? Through table-top role-playing games, students can explore being the 'other' in a game, a safe space where their imagination can take them anywhere. After all, how can teachers, support staff, and administrators help foster our future leaders if those students whom we interact with don't have the tools to be empathetic? This afternoon's session will teach you how to play but also how we can explore those social-emotional learning tools of empathy - seeing the world through other people's eyes, and exploring our emotional states in a safe and caring environment. Role-playing games also encompass interactive storytelling - the story of the game is the primary driver. We learn rules that help guide the narrative as a group moves towards a common purpose. We also incorporate mathematics in addressing decisionmaking through probability - a twenty-sided dice has many ways of expressing percentages to a student. D&D also demonstrates to our students having a working knowledge of math as a valuable and applicable asset. "Despite its outward appearance as a frivolous escape from reality, the fantasy genre has profound metaphorical correspondences to the real world. Tolkien's influential Lord of the Rings, for example, has been interpreted as symbolically capturing the horrors he experienced as a soldier in World War I, as an allegory of power, and as an exploration of addiction. The enchanted settings are veiled representations of universal human experiences and emotional truths." ("How Dungeons & Dragons Can Help Kids Develop Social-Emotional Learning Skills", KQED) Pre-registration is necessary as materials will be provided.
